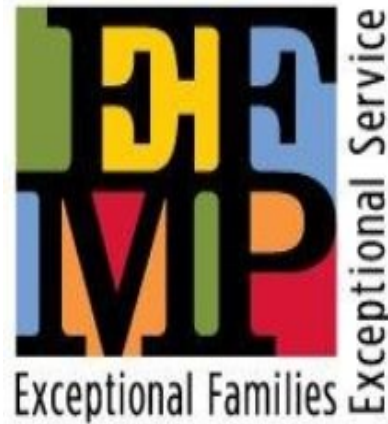


EFMP Coordinator: Inform and Educate the base populace about EFMP, emphasizing community support. Connects Airmen and their families with support services for special needs, advocacy assistance and helps provided a continuum of care to facilitate a seamless transition from installation to Installation. Works in partnership with all involved providing Exceptional Service to Exceptional Families.

EFMP-M (Medical): Enroll Airmen and register family members in the active EFMP database. Train and outreach to support EFMP requirements within the Medical Treatment Facility, with a emphasis on identification of special needs during routine medical care. Screens family members for OCONUS/CONUS travel, checking for service availability at projected location.

EFMP-A (Assignments): Considers the medical and educational needs of the Exceptional Family Member (EFM) during the assignment process.
